We polled the committee membership and Automotive IAB and received a number of workshop proposals. The committee proposed four workshops to the meeting committee. In the end, the Venice meeting committee chose an automotive topic as a State of the Industry Briefing. John Carney and Heinz Goddar collaborated to determine specific topics and find speakers.

The committee was fortunate to have all four workshops accepted. They are 1) Automotive Industry Transformations -New challenges and opportunities in autonomous driving and connected cars (from Automotive IAB) – in addition to the State of the Industry Briefing, 2) Antitrust & Patent Law - Views from judges and government regulators on how antitrust and patent law cooperate in fostering innovation (from Roberto Dini), Aggregation Is the New Black – Patent pool and other tools to remove friction from licensing transactions (from Fogliacco - Sisvel) and 4) EUROPEAN COMPETITION LAW - An overview of the new European framework & new block exemption regulations for vertical and
